## Membership

- There will be some changes to the e-Student newsletter scheme in preparation for the forthcoming implementation of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). This will include explaining more clearly what students are signing up for, for how long, and will also state our privacy policy. Draft details of this will be in the next issue and your input will be appreciated.
- We had a target of 1,200 new e-Student sign ups; this has been exceeded via a combination of the UCAS mailshot, your communications to new undergraduates, and sign-ups from talks and events.
- There is a target of 300 for conversions from the e-Student population to Student or Associate Membership. This is calculated by manually comparing the lists of new members with the e-Student spreadsheet listing at year end and mid-year so no data to report this issue.

## **Council Meeting**

• There was a meeting of IMA Council on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November: look out for highlights and papers appearing in the dropbox folder soon. We will let you know via Basecamp when these are uploaded.

## **Employers' Forum**

• There was an <u>IMA Employers' Forum</u> on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> November at EDF Energy's Barnwood site on the theme of *Diversity, Inclusion and Employability*. A report will be posted in the dropbox soon. There was a good selection of speakers; some very lively, positive discussions and lots of tips on best practice.

## Postgraduate and Undergraduate Liaison

- We have 23 awards of £360 for undergraduate maths societies and 10 awards of £400 for Joint IMA / SIAM Chapters (predominantly postgraduate). We reduced the amount of the undergraduate award slightly to enable more awards. So far this academic year we have awarded:
  - 13 undergraduate grants to Aberystwyth, Aberdeen, Aston, Derby, Dundee, Glasgow, Heriot-Watt, Imperial, Newcastle, QMUL, Surrey, UCL, and Warwick.
  - 5 Joint IMA / SIAM Chapter grants to the Bath, Cardiff, Manchester, Reading, and Strathclyde Chapters.

- If your maths societies / joint IMA / SIAM Chapters have not applied yet please encourage them!
- We have a target of 60 events at different universities (see the visits list on the IMA University Liaison webpage. Coverage (events and grants) is 37 to date.

## **Maths Teaching Training Scholarships**

- The Maths Teacher Training Scholarships are available again this year, and applications opened on 16<sup>th</sup> October. The offering this year is a £22k tax-free bursary during the initial teacher training (ITT) year, followed by two payments of at least £5k (enhanced payments of £7.5k if teaching in specified areas in England) in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> year of teaching, providing they have taught in a state-funded school in England since completing ITT.
- A variety of promotional events have been booked, still to come are a selection of Café Maths events: a chance to find out about teaching as well as the scholarships in a relaxed environment.
